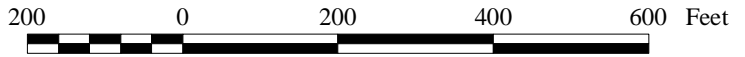










Bear Hill Parcel

Sources:

- Roads, streams, and wetlands were mapped by WRC GIS staff using a Trimble Pathfinder GPS (Global Positioning System) receiver in February and March 1999. Post-processing included differential correction and manual line generalization. Positional accuracy can be five meters or greater.

- The property boundaries were located by William FitzGerald, Land Surveyor, Putney, Vt.,. Property corners were captured by WRC GIS staff using a GPS receiver. Data were differentially corrected, and positional accuracy should be one to three meters.

- The locations of ledges and utility lines are approximate. Information on their locations are from GPS data collection and general field mapping.
